In this document it is mentioned all the rules and regulations where there was a change in content.

To simplify the rules, all text in the new version of the rules was revised and rewritten and a new structure was created to explain the rules.

In red text - the text it was deleted.

All exceptions of the rules or recommendations where Competition Regulations ("CR") may change or adapt the requirements of the main rules of korfball is now in a new document and not in the Rules of Korfball. All changes concerning this exceptions or recommendation are also described in this document.
