IKF World Korfball Championship 2023

Less than a year to go before the top korfball countries compete again on the biggest stage! All qualification tournament will be concluded before the end of this year, so we will know who to welcome in Chinese Taipei in October 2023! The IKF Council has published the decision to have 24 teams at the IKF World Korfball Championship, the biggest number to date. Want to know which countries have already secured their spot, and learn more about the background of this decision?

IKF EU World Korfball Championship Qualifier-B

Two places for the IKF WKC 2023 were up for grabs in Türkiye in the beginning of November. The competition was strong, but eventually Catalonia came on top and went home with the trophy and that desired ticket for the IKF WKC 2023. The battle for second place and thus the final qualification spot took place on the final day, with a spectacular match between Hungary and Türkiye. Supported by their home crowd, Türkiye claimed the victory by a 11-9.

IKF Korfball Champions League Round 2

The second round of the IKF Korfball Champions League was hosted by the Czech Korfball Association from 18-20 November. Six national champions and two qualifiers from the first round were competing for two spots in the IKF KCL R3. Trojans KC, TuS Schildgen, SK RG Prostějov and SG Pegasus made it to the semi-finals, where they needed to win to proceed to Round 3. England Champion Trojans faced a tough battle against German champion Pegasus, but managed to win. TuS Schildgen was too strong for SK RG Prostějov and also qualified for the IKF KCL R3. They even managed to win the final, a spectacular achievement after qualifying for this tournament in Round 1.

IKF Asia-Oceania Korfball Championship 2022

The IKF Asia-Oceania Korfball Championship 2022 is in full swing. Chinese Taipei and China have reached the the final, while Australia and New Zealand will compete for the bronze medal. Live streams of all matches will be available today on worldkorfball.sport.

IKF All-Africa Korfball Championship South

The second continental championship of this year in Africa took place in Lusaka, Zambia. Three countries aimed to qualify for the IKF World Korfball Championship 2023; Zambia, Zimbabwe and South-Africa. All matches were extremely close, and it is fair to say that all three countries had a great chance of claiming first place. In the end, it was Zimbabwe who managed to win all their matches and therefore qualified for the IKF WKC 2023! Runner-up was South Africa, Zambia finished third.

The match schedule for the IKF Korfball Champions League Round 3 will be published soon. Four clubs will compete in Herentals, Belgium from 6-7 January: PKC/Vertom, K. Borgerhout/Groen-Wit K.C., Trojans KC and TuS Schildgen 1932 e.V.

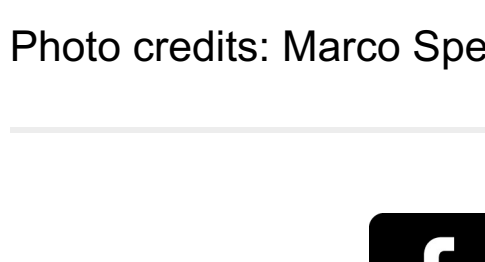

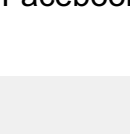


My name is Emma Terho, I am an ice hockey player from Finland. I am a five-time Olympian.

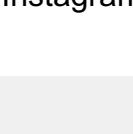
