

IKF ANNUAL STATISTICAL ANTI-DOPING REPORT

2022

The International Korfball Federation (IKF) has concluded the operations of the IKF Test Distribution Plan (TDP) and Anti-Doping Program 2022. This annual report serves as evidence of our commitment to transparency in accordance with Code Article 14.4. The report encompasses a wide range of Doping Control activities, as defined by the World Anti-Doping Code (WADC), which include all steps and processes from test distribution planning through to ultimate disposition of any appeal and the enforcement of consequences.

Education

During IKF events, our organization made sure that korfball athletes received comprehensive education pertaining to their rights and responsibilities in accordance with the Code. This education was primarily delivered through educational sessions provided by the National Anti-Doping Organizations (NADOs) of the respective host countries. Our primary focus for education was on U19 and International-Level Athletes. In addition, awareness campaigns were carried out at select IKF events to further promote anti-doping awareness among participants.

Therapeutic Use Exemptions (TUES)

IKF has formal agreements in place to recognize Therapeutic Use Exemptions (TUEs) granted by NADOs. It's noteworthy that during 2022, we did not receive any TUE requests directly. However, IKF did recognize and accept 3 TUEs granted by NADOs as per our established protocols.

Whereabouts Pools

In the interest of accurate whereabouts management, the IKF established an "Other Pool" as defined in ISTI Article 4.8.11. This pool included approximately 48 athletes from 6 nations. Athletes in this pool were required to diligently submit their team whereabouts on a quarterly basis via the Anti-Doping Administration and Management System (ADAMS). We are pleased to report that in 2022, there were no whereabouts filling failures to report within the IKF Other Pool. Furthermore, it's important to note

that IKF did not have players in the Registered Testing Pool.

Testing

In 2022, the IKF conducted a total of 6 Out-of-Competition Tests (OOCT) and 28 In-Competition Tests (ICT). Additionally, 8 In-Competition Tests were carried out on IKF korfball athletes during The World Games 2022 competition. While these numbers demonstrate our commitment to testing, it's important to acknowledge that a significant portion of testing in the sport of korfball is carried out by National Anti-Doping Organizations. The precise total number of tests conducted in the sport of Korfball will be updated in accordance with the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) testing figures for 2022 as provided in the WADA Annual Statistics report.

Results

We are pleased to report that all tests conducted in 2022 yielded negative results, with no Adverse Analytical Findings (AAFs) identified. This positive outcome is attributed to the full cooperation of all athletes who were subject to testing. It is with satisfaction that we confirm that no doping cases needed to be reported for the year 2022.

In conclusion, the IKF remains dedicated to upholding the principles of anti-doping in the sport of korfball. This report represents our commitment to transparency and accountability as required by the World Anti-Doping Code (WADC). We will continue to work diligently in the fight against doping, ensuring that our athletes compete in a fair and clean environment.
